Doxey Hub

The Parish Council have submitted a bid to Clarion to secure a license to run the hub for a trial period. Assuming this is successful a longer term lease will be sought for the building.

It is hoped that the building can be used for community groups and activities.

Castle View Park

The Parish Council have implemented fortnightly grass cutting and weekly litterpicking and inspections. We ask for your patience during this first year as we will review how effective these are and whether the frequency needs to be changed.

Please be aware that residents need to use the bins or take their litter home with them. Some groups have been observed leaving litter in the middle of the park and this does spoil it for other users.

The Council are also considering adding a zip wire, basket swing and a piece of toddler equipment along with several picnic benches. We are currently waiting confirmation from Stafford Borough Council about whether we require planning permission. Once this is confirmed grant bids will be sent to Awards for All and Tesco Bags of Help. If the council is successful it is hoped the equipment can be in place towards the end of 2018—assuming there are no planning delays raised.

Community Asset Listing—Doxey Pitch

We have applied to list the pitch at the rear of The Drive as a community asset. Councillors have become concerned that the pitch may be being earmarked for housing in the future with pitch provision moved out of the area. As such, listing the asset will give the community a say in what happens to it and allow the council to bid to purchase it in the event of a sale of the land.

Doxey Roll of Honour

Following extensive research by Doxey resident and ex-Parish Councillor Ken Allman the names of 9 men lost in the First World War and 1 in the Second World War from Doxey have been identified.

A permanent memorial is planned in Doxey Church and the Parish Council are keen to hear from anyone with additional information about Doxey residents lost in the World Wars to ensure the list is as complete as possible.

The current information held is shown below:

BOULT Alfred Edward. 21 years. Private, Grenadier Guards. Killed in action at Hulluch on 21st October, 1915. Son of - Alfred and Lucy Boult, 'Abbotsford', Doxey, Stafford.

BOWERS Edward M. Age not known. Private, 2/6th North Staffordshire Regiment. Killed in France 30th October, 1917.

Next of Kin not Known. Resided at 'Rosemount', Doxey, Stafford.

BULLBROOK Samuel. 28 years. Lance Corporal, Kings Own Rifle Corps. Severely wounded (no date given) but died of his wounds on 27th March, 1920.

Son of Mrs A. Bullbrook, 267 Ventnor Terrace, Doxey, Stafford.

CLARKE William Ernest. 26 years. Private, Alexandra, Princess of Wales Own (Yorkshire Regiment). Killed 23rd April, 1917.

Resided at 1 Ventnor Terrace, Doxey, Stafford. Son of Edgar and Ada Clarke, 1 Clarke's Court, North Walls, Stafford.

COOKE Walter. 23 years. Corporal, Royal Field Artillery. Died of his wounds on 1st December, 1917.

Next of kin not known. Resided at 5 Cottage Lane, Doxey, Stafford.

HODSON Alfred. Age not known. Private, York and Lancaster Regiment. Killed in France 28th March, 1918. Next of kin not known. Resided at 119 Scarcliffe, Doxey, Stafford.

JERVIS Harry. Age not known. Acting Bombardier, Royal Garrison Artillery. Killed at Arras on 22nd April, 1917. Son of - George Jervis, 208 Kirkstone, Doxey, Stafford.

OSBORNE Bertram. 24 years. Sapper, Royal Engineers (254th Tunnelling Company. Died at home of his wounds on 1st October, 1918.

Son of Mr J. H. and Mrs S. A. Osborne, 78 Doxey, Stafford.

WHEAVER Joseph Lowndes. 28 years. Lance Corporal, Royal Engineers. Killed, location not known on 25th July, 1916. Son of John Thomas and Harriet Fanny Wheaver, 'Lyndhurst', Doxey, Stafford.

Second World War

HAGGETT Harry. 19 years. Sergeant (Wireless Operator/Air Gunner), 51 Squadron, Royal Air Force. Killed during operations over Germany on the 17th August,1940. Son of George and Florence Haggett, Ventnor Terrace, Doxey, Stafford.
